Reporting Formalities Directive



Directive 2010/65 on Reporting Formalities for ships arriving in/departing from EU ports (RFD)

- National Single Window (NSW) for receiving port call notifications to be established by 1 June 2015
- Information in electronic format and "only once"
- Sharing of information at national level with all authorities involved in ship clearance
- Exchange of relevant information at EU level via SSN
- No single EU solution imposed



Tools RFD implementation

- Non-binding guidelines, including business rules and a NSW data set, developed within the eMS group
- 5 EU MS (BG, EL, IT, MT and RO) and NO cooperated with EMSA on NSW prototype
- AnNa pilots



State of play RFD implementation

- Feedback MS: NSW implementation either partially or fully completed, harmonisation of different port systems and coordination of different authorities are main difficulties encountered
- Feedback industry: multitude of systems, lack of harmonisation, absence of machine-to-machine data exchange solutions



Way forward

- Optimisation of RFD implementation via eMS group and peer reviews
- Enforcement of the RFD implementation (remedial measures in case of non-compliance)
- REFIT evaluation of the legislation (2016) and possible revision of the Directive after an impact assessment (2017)



Way forward

- Open issues: harmonisation of optional formalities such as ship clearance, data quality, re-use of data for subsequent port calls, single EU user identity, updating of NSW Data map, harmonisation of nationally required formalities, harmonised cargo manifest
- Clear need for further harmonisation
- Final objective = European Maritime Single Window (EMSW)
- Launch eManifest and EMSW initiative



eManifest and European Maritime Single Window initiative



Long outstanding issue

- 2009: European maritime transport space without barriers
- 2010: RFD inclusion of FAL 2
- 2011: Blue Belt pilot project
- 2012: Single Market Act II
- 2013: Communication on Blue Belt, a single transport area for shipping
- 2014: simplification of the RSS procedure
- 2014/2015: customs goods manifest
- 2016/2017: eManifest and EMSW initiative



Objectives of the eManifest and EMSW initiative – a comprehensive eManifest

- Establish a fully harmonised eManifest encompassing cargo formalities required by both maritime and customs authorities
- Reduce administrative burden of the shipping industry by applying the reporting once principle
- Test processes increasing the efficiency of maritime transport
- Enhance the NSW prototype to the EMSW prototype allowing for the submission of the eManifest together with the other reporting formalities




Objectives of the eManifest and EMSW initiative – exchange of eManifest

- Allow Member States to receive cargo information on departure from last EU port
- Assess whether the exchange of eManifest can minimise the reporting obligations for ships trading between EU ports, as well as when the voyage includes non-EU ports
- Assess the tracking of cargo carried onboard ships, including portraying it on a graphical interface

All supported formalities mapped into one unique set of data elements



- Active participation of Commission services (DG MOVE + DG TAXUD) and EMSA, the maritime and customs authorities as well as industry stakeholders = key!
- **CION** priority ambitious timeline: first results to be expected by February 2017. In parallel, evaluation and revision process of the legislation is launched.
- Strong interest of MS in the initiative; 14 will actively participate.
- Ongoing consultations with different industry stakeholders (shipping industry, ports, agents, etc.)
