In the past, ports represented the main entrance to the city, places of market and, at the same time, public spaces and meeting areas for different cultures. In the last 150 years ports and cities have slowly but surely been separated in spatial, functional as well as in administrative terms. As a result, the interface, the area where the city physically meets the port, is undefined and the link between city and port requires a rethinking. The following seminar explores the "meeting" between two different port cities: Naples and Rotterdam. The main goal is to establish a dialogue between research and institution in order to understand how to plan cities with ports moving beyond a functional and sectorial



planning.
